This afternoon, Governor Schwarzenegger announced that he is appointing Los Angeles City Controller Laura Chick to a new position as inspector general of the federal stimulus money that California will be receiving. City Auditor Doud released a statement in support of the Governor's creation of the new position and in his choice of Laura Chick to the post.
